Conceptual streetscaping plans show more pedestrian-friendly beachfront

At the May 12 Coordinated Committee meeting, the committee received a presentation on conceptual streetscaping plans for town-owned land at the beachfront.

David Wood and Allan Brownridge of Envision Tatham Inc. provided the update. The presentation is available for review on the town's website and on the town's YouTube channel. See the 24:30 mark.

Planned for the area is a far more pedestrian-friendly design with numerous vistas and access points to the beach.

Town-owned beachfront properties declared surplus

Council, at its May 26 meeting, officially declared town-owned properties at the beachfront as "surplus" to the municipality's needs in keeping with its Sale of Land Policy.

The declaration is part of the process to redevelop the site. Council members also approved using a direct sale method to sell the land to a preferred purchaser. Negotiations with the town's preferred developer – Bayloc Developments Inc. – continue. Watch our website for updates on this subject.

On a related note, council approved retaining Darren Neil and Sons Excavating Inc. for the first phase of building demolition work on beachfront properties, at a cost of \$79,390, excluding HST.

In addition, council directed staff to retain a consultant to assess the composition of the two buildings that will comprise the second phase of demolition work. See www.wasaqabeach.com for further details.

Fireworks rules and regulations

Planning to set off fireworks? Make sure you know the rules. Under the town's bylaw, there are four days when fireworks can be used.

- Victoria Day
- Canada Day
- New Year's Eve
- New Year's Day

Fireworks are prohibited outside of those days. Fireworks can only be set off on private property, unless a public display permit is obtained through the town.

Outdoor fire regulations

If you are enjoying a fire in your yard, make sure you follow the rules. In Wasaga Beach, the only acceptable material for burning is dry seasoned firewood.

Fires are not permitted between 1 a.m. and 6 a.m.

As well, fires should not be left unattended. They should also be fully extinguished when you are done.

In addition, please ensure that someone at least 16 years old or older is supervising the fire.

The local man received the honour during a special presentation Sunday, June 5.

"On behalf of town council and staff, I congratulate Aaron on this significant honour. His exemplary character and sportsmanship, combined with his skill on the football field, make him a deserving recipient," Mayor Nina Bifolchi said.

Lavers earned a silver medal as a linebacker while playing for the U16 Team Ontario in 2019.

At the regional level, he has been a member of the Huronia Stallions for 11 years. He also has served as a team captain at the varsity level. During the 2021 season, Lavers was ranked the second best defensive player in the regional league and best overall linebacker in the county.

"I was so fortunate to have a leader like Aaron. He made my job easy. He showed up ready to work every day, and stayed after practice to get as many reps in as possible to ensure his best performance on the field."

Kempster said Lavers is an overall good young man.

"He displays great attitude. Aaron is polite, and humble, always willing to work, or change something in order to improve," Kempster said.
