Enclosed is your water bill for the months of July and August 2019. If your water bill indicates a balance forward, it's important to note that interest has been calculated to the current billing date. Interest will be applied at 1.25% on the first day of each month thereafter. For your convenience, your water bill can be paid in the comfort of your home through online banking.

Please contact the Water Clerk at (705) 429-3844 ext. 2245 if you experience any of the following:

- If the property was <u>occupied</u> during this billing cycle but both the **Previous and Current Read are the same.**
- If the current bill reflects 'Flat Rate Residential' water/sewer rates.



Now when you visit Town Hall to make a payment you can receive your receipt via email. Ask a Customer Service Representative for further details.

# The town is also offering paperless water and tax bills.

Sign up for e-billing and receive your bills via e-mail. If you would like to sign up for this option please e-mail ebilling@ wasagabeach.com and include the following:

- **1** The subject line should state the municipal property address, starting with the street name. For example, Main Street 123.
- **2** The body of the e-mail should state your name and phone number.
- **3** The e-mail must come from the e-mail address you want the bill sent to.

### Convenience credit card payments

Through the town's website using Plastiq (third party), you can pay your property tax and/or water/wastewater bill by Visa, Mastercard, or American Express.

There will be a service fee of 2.5 percent applied by the servicer provider, Plastiq.

Please note that there are several low or no-cost means of paying your bill with The Town of Wasaga Beach. These include equal payment plan, telephone banking, mailing a cheque, or placing a payment in our drop box.

# Call us to arrange water shut off

If you are a seasonal resident and wish to have your water turned off, please contact the Public Works Department to schedule an appointment. To book an appointment, call 705-429-2540, ext. 2305 or e-mail h.kenney@ wasagabeach.com.

For water shut off, please drain your pipes and ensure the water meter is completely drained. It is strongly recommended that a professional, licensed, insured plumber be obtained to winterize your residence.

Note the owner of the property must be present during the water shut off or town staff will not proceed with the work.

# Water conservation rebates are available!

The Town of Wasaga Beach has a water conservation rebate program.

When you install a low flow or dual flush toilet you are eligible for a \$70 rebate.

Residents who install a rain barrel can get a \$30 rebate.

Please note that only property owners on municipal water are eligible for the rebate. You can find rebate forms at www.wasagabeach. com or pick one up at town hall at 30 Lewis St.

Applicants must include copies of receipts indicating that they purchased the particular item. Completed forms and supporting documentation can be presented at town hall.

The rebate will be applied to your next water bill.

### Strong start to 2019 building season in Wasaga Beach

Building activity in Wasaga Beach for the first half of 2019 is the highest it has been for that period in the last three years.

"Our development community, as well as smaller contractors and private citizens, are feeling good about the opportunities here and they are moving forward with significant investment," said Danny Rodgers, director of Building and Development Standards for the Town of Wasaga Beach.

To date this year, the town has issued 322 building permits, compared to 207 for the same period last year and 284 for 2017.

Permits issued for single-family dwellings sit at 66 this year, while the number of permits for town house units is 124. Residential additions and renovations account for an additional 45 permits to date.

The value of construction sits at \$55-million

The town is investing \$89,885 to create a Parks and Trails Master Plan.

The plan will provide a framework to manage and sustain parks, trails, and open space in a cost-effective, proactive manner.

The plan will guide the municipality for the next decade.

so far in 2019 and the town anticipates a strong second half of the year as additional residential development projects start.

"Wasaga Beach is an attractive and affordable place to be if you are raising a young family and it's equally appealing if you are retired. These two demographics are driving the building activity we see in town," said Rodgers.

Mayor Nina Bifolchi agrees.

"Our community offers a wonderful quality of life and we know that is one of the key reasons people choose to settle here," Mayor Bifolchi said. "Our council will continue to invest in services and amenities that maintain and enhance our town. We are moving Wasaga Beach forward through investments in our arena, library, public transit, roads, parks and trails."

Mayor Bifolchi noted the town expects to see substantial new building permit activity in the years ahead as the redevelopment of town-owned land at the beachfront takes place.

### Main Street Bridge project getting under way

The town is investing \$6.1-million on the rehabilitation of the Main Street Bridge.

Council awarded the project to Dagmar Construction, following a competitive process. This is the same company that refurbished the Schoonertown Bridge.

The Main Street Bridge was constructed around 1960. The scope of the rehabilitation work includes patching, waterproofing, paving of the concrete deck, refacing and widening sidewalks, upgrading concrete abutments, as well as new street and navigation lighting.

Work on the bridge started after Labour Day.

Construction completion is anticipated by June 2021.
